To make your record count we need to know where you saw your animal or plant. You could write down the name of the place and the postcode, for example Norwich, NR1 1RY, but the best way to help pinpoint what you saw is to give a six figure grid reference eg: TL 873 822.

## KING'S LYNN

**Butterflies, Birds and Bees of Harding's Pits** Join Nick Acheson as he looks for wildlife on this green space that runs along the River Ouse. Who knows what wildlife gems might be found.

**Saturday 4 June, 12.30-2pm** Meet at the Whale Statue, Harding's Pits, Kings Lynn. No need to book, just turn-up and join in.
