Welcome to our March biodiversity e-bulletin

The Norfolk Biodiversity Partnership (NBP) welcomed over 100 delegates to its highly successful Biodiversity Forum this month. A great line up of speakers brought together the worlds of development, business and biodiversity to explore how we can deliver benefits for economic prosperity alongside caring for our ecology. Keynote speaker, Andy Wood who is Chair of New Anglia Local Enterprise Partnership (and CEO of Adnams) drew from his own experience to illustrate how business and biodiversity can go hand in hand. Environmentalist and author Tony Juniper eloquently explained that the idea that we must choose between economic development or protecting nature is a myth: the important thing is to find an integrated approach so that we can do both together. Other inspiring speakers included: Iain Dunnett (New Anglia LEP); Susie Vernon (Beyond Green); Haidee Bishop (NBP); Andrea Kelly (Broads Authority) and Will Burchnall (Broads Authority). Another headline for this issue is a plea for help. Nominations for the NBP's Community Biodiversity Awards are now open: do you know of a group, individual, project or local business that deserves an award for their efforts to make a difference for wildlife in their local communities? This year, in addition to the four 'usual' Award categories (Site; Individual; Group and Education) the Partnership is hoping to attract entrants from local businesses, to flag up the role they can play in supporting local conservation activities. Martin Horlock who heads up NBIS, was invited to a special event at the Natural History Museum to celebrate the National Biodiversity Network's (NBN) "Quarter of a billion records" project. Martin took along posters showing how NBIS is working to engage with local communities to inspire recording and add to our knowledge base. More under National News.

Last week the Broads Authority ran a very successful Invasive alien afternoon in conjunction with NNNSI. The event attracted over 70 people keen to find out how to stop the damage caused by invasive non-native

plants and animals.
